### I. Installation

This plugin requires Final Cut Pro. We wish Final Cut Express supported it, but no such luck.

1. Quit Final Cut Pro if it is running.
2. Take the “IMC FCP Plugin.bundle” and put it in  
/Library/Application Support/Final Cut Pro System  
Support/Plugins
3. Launch Final Cut Pro


## II. Use

In Final Cut Pro there will now be an option under the File:Export menu that should say DV NTSC 48k - (IMC). If you choose that you will simply be prompted for a place to save you exported clip. That's it!


## III. Editing the plugin preferences

To support other formats you must edit the plugin preferences. Maybe in the future we will build a preference panel to set the options but in the meantime it is "manual"

The plist is in the plugin, so go to the plugin




Cntrl (right) click on it




Select "Show Package Contents"

In the Contents folder there is an IMCFCPPluginPreferences.plist



If you double click it, it should open into the Property Editor



Change the "Setting" property to the preset you want it to use... like "DV PAL 48 kHz", save it and relaunch FCP

The menu should reflect the change
